EMPLOYER RESPONSIBILITIES

In no way whatsoever does it relieve the Contractor participating in this program from any responsibility imposed upon the Contractor under The Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act R.S.O. 1970, c.47, and any Amendments and Regulations passed pursuant thereto.

You are not qualified to use a "BCACWQ" tested welder unless you have forwarded to the Boilermaker Contractors' Association a completed and signed Boilermaker Contractors' Association of Ontario Participant Declaration Form. Your Company name will then be added to the list of qualified Contractors authorized to use "BCACWQ" tested welders.

You are responsible to ensure that the owner accepts "BCACWQ" tested welders prior to the commencement of the first weld.

You are responsible to ensure that the welding inspector responsible for the area you are working in is notified of your intentions to use "BCACWQ" tested welders.

You are responsible to ensure that the welder has proper certification prior to the commencement of his first weld and that the welding process being used by the welder is within the essential variable to which the welder was tested under the "BCACWQ" program.

You are responsible to ensure that the "BCACWQ" tested welder is aware of all weld procedure requirements.

You are responsible to ensure that any welder working on your site is retested if his ticket expires before the completion of his dispatched assignment.

You are responsible in ensuring that all of your field personnel are aware of the "BCACWQ" welding ticket being used.

You are responsible to ensure that all of your personnel are aware of the contractor responsibilities and have the required welding procedure documentation.

You may retest a welder at your cost at any time.
