ONTARIO MINISTRY OF LABOUR (MOL) 1) MOL REGULATORY CONSULTATION

BCA of Ontario Contractor:

The Ministry of Labour is proposing to strengthen health and safety protection for Ontario's construction workers under the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA).

The ministry has developed three regulatory consultation proposals for public review. The purpose of the consultation proposals is to describe the ministry's proposed policy direction and invite comments from the public and stakeholders. **The comment period is from October 28 ending on December 29, 2014.**

1) Foundation Drill Rigs

The ministry is proposing to add new requirements to the Construction Projects Regulation (O. Reg. 213/91) to enhance health and safety protection of workers during the operation of rotary foundation drill rigs.

2) Occupational Health Protection for Construction Workers

The ministry is proposing three key regulatory changes to improve worker protection from hazardous exposures to:

- 1) noise; 2) biological and chemical agents;
- 3) carbon monoxide released from internal combustion engines.

3) Miscellaneous amendments to the Construction Projects Regulation

The ministry is proposing to make miscellaneous amendments to the Construction Projects Regulation to correct errors, omissions, and inconsistencies and update outdated references in the Regulation.

4) The ministry is consulting on the extension of noise protection requirements to workplaces not covered by current noise requirements under the Occupational Health and Safety Act regulations.
